

From Friar Alum **Dr. Pravin George:** Although much of the NYC experience is a blur in my





memories. I vividly remember first stepping onto United flight 3011, a flight serviced only by volunteer crew. The pilot mentioned that his daughter was a nurse and that this mission to NYC was also something very personally important to him. I also remember landing at Newark Airport to signs from the grounds crew welcoming us and a transport taking us to the hospitals in the center of Queens, Brooklyn and Manhattan. As we stepped into the COVID-19 epicenter, we were just a group of 25 people. We didn't bring much, but probably what helped out more than anything else was some sense of hope that they weren't alone in this fight.
